


Show and Tell

Buyers & Sellers may pre-register online, in advance of the auction. This is optional, but HIGHLY RECOMMENDED to minimize your check-in time. Pre-registered Buyers & Sellers will have the ability to preview other pre-registered items and view photos (if made available by the Seller). On-site registration is still available for buyers and sellers.

For complete instructions on how to pre-register online, go to www.jefcoeromodlers.org.

BASIC INFORMATION FOR SELLERS:

- When you arrive at the auction, leave your items in your vehicle - come inside and check in first.
- A \$10 Buyer/Seller registration fee will be charged at check-in.
- A 15% donation to the Jefco Aeromod'lers Club #176 will be retained for each item sold.
- A \$4 transaction fee will be charged to the seller for each item that receives no winning bid - as it is sent to the PASS Table.
- All items and/or money owed must be collected/paid for by the close of the event on Sunday.
- Items not collected or paid for by close of auction on Sunday will be deemed a DONATION to the Jefco Aeromod'lers Club.
- Payments to sellers will be made via club check - NO CASH will be paid out.
- All items must have a realistic value of at least \$25. Several items of lesser value may be grouped together for a combined value of \$25.
- No magazines, fuel or junk. We reserve the right to reject items for sale that do not meet auction standards.
- Small or grouped items should be in clear plastic bags and stapled shut when practical.
- There are 3 options for pricing:
 1. **NO MINIMUM PRICE** - If no minimum is listed, item will be sold to the highest bidder. If there are no offers of at least \$15, the item will be sent to a PASS Table.
 2. **MINIMUM PRICE** - You may specify a minimum price for each item at time of check-in. If there are no offers of, at least, the specified minimum bid the item will be sent to a PASS Table.
 3. **BUY-IT-NOW** - You may specify a BUY-IT-NOW price and it may be purchased before going to auction block and bypass the auction block entirely. Note! A BUY-IT-NOW price can only be placed on an item at time of check-in. BUY-IT-NOW prices may not be added or changed after an item has been checked in. If there is no Minimum Price, put a "N/A" for "not applicable" in the appropriate column on the auction form.

BASIC INFORMATION FOR BUYERS:

- ALL SALES ARE FINAL. NO RETURNS OR EXCHANGES. Any issues related to items purchased should be directed to the seller of the item.
- BUY-IT-NOW items will have a \$4 transaction fee added at checkout paid by the buyer.
- Buyers will be charged local sales tax (currently 4.6%) at time of checkout.
- Payments are due before the close of the auction on Sunday.
- Only CASH or CREDIT CARD payment will be accepted - No Checks!
